Background

LASER PULSE (Long-term Assistance and Services for Research Partners for University-Led Solutions Engine) is a five-year, \$70M program funded through USAID's Innovation, Technology, and Research Hub, that delivers research-driven solutions to field-sourced development challenges in USAID Partner countries. A consortium led by Purdue University, with core partners Catholic Relief Services, Indiana University, Makerere University, and the University of Notre Dame, implements the LASER PULSE program through a growing network of 2,700+ researchers and development practitioners in 62 countries.

LASER PULSE collaborates with USAID missions, bureaus, and independent offices and other local stakeholders to identify research needs for critical development challenges, and funds and strengthens the capacity of researcher-practitioner teams to co-design solutions that translate into policy and practice.

One of the goals of LASER PULSE is to convene and catalyze a global network of universities, local government, non-government organizations, and the private sector for research-driven practical solutions to critical development challenges. These convenings, called “Research for Development (R4D) workshops,” bring together researchers and practitioners, as well as development partners and government, to share experiences and expertise in effective translation of solutions, policies, and practices. LASER PULSE conducted two R4D workshops in 2019, one in Uganda for Eastern Africa and one in Columbia. In addition to the 2022 workshop in Ethiopia, Indiana University and LASER PULSE will be organizing another R4D in Vietnam.

The R4D Workshop in Ethiopia is a highly participatory event attended by researchers and practitioners / implementers, including (a) Ethiopian and U.S. university researchers and experts in resilience and youth development, (b) representatives from NGOs and private sector entities, (c) representatives from government entities, and (d) representatives from USAID/Ethiopia and USAID/Washington DC as well as other donor and development partners.

The major objectives of the R4D workshop are to

1. Facilitate and promote continuous engagement and networking with cross-sector partners for sustainable and effective research translation;
2. Create opportunities for LASER grant awardees in Ethiopia to share an overview of their research and expected outcomes with a wider audience of researchers and practitioners, as well as private sector, donors and development partners;
3. Provide opportunities for a wider pool of researchers and practitioners in Ethiopia to be better informed of the LASER PULSE model of evidence-based solutions to development challenges; and
4. Promote and widely disseminate USAID's Higher Education Solutions Network (HESN) vision and the new Higher Education Learning Agenda.
